
The celebration concluded with the traditional Onasadhya, a grand vegetarian feast served on banana leaves, which brought everyone together in the true spirit of Onam.

### INTEGRATING ORIGAMI INTO MATHEMATICS LEARNING

A two-day workshop titled "Introduction to Math with Origami" and "Visualising Concepts in Mathematics with Origami" was conducted by the Department of Science and Humanities, Christ University, on 12th and 13th September at the Kengeri Campus.

Origami, the traditional Japanese art of paper folding, is not only a creative pursuit but also a fascinating gateway to understanding mathematical concepts. Through the practice of folding paper, participants explored ideas related to geometry, symmetry, algebra, and even calculus. The first session was conducted by Ms. Kavitha Deshpande, who explained how Origami can be effectively used to visualise mathematical concepts, especially in middle school mathematics.

Origami inherently involves geometric shapes and transformations. By folding paper into squares, triangles, and rectangles, learners develop a deeper understanding of angles, similarity, and congruence. In the afternoon session, Ms. Dassaseverova demonstrated how to fold regular polygons and explained how Origami can be used to teach fractions and ratios, helping to illustrate the concepts of division and proportionality.

On the second day, 13th September (Saturday), Ms. Kavitha Deshpande conducted a session on the application of Origami in high school geometry, which was highly informative. The afternoon session, led by Ms. Archana Morye, focused on parabolas and hyperbolas, offering practical methods to visualise these curves through paper folding.






### A DAY OF FUN, ADVENTURE, AND DISCOVERY AT FUN WORLD AND BANGALORE AQUARIUM



### CHRIST SCHOOL CISCE, BENGALURU IN COLLABORATION WITH MARIA-WARD-REALSCHULE, NEUBURG, GERMANY

The Indo-German Student Exchange Programme 2025 marked a significant milestone in Christ School CISCE's commitment to global education and intercultural collaboration. Conducted in partnership with Maria-Ward-Realschule, Neuburg, Germany, the programme was envisioned as a platform to promote international understanding, mutual respect, and collaborative academic engagement. Months of planning between the two institutions culminated in an initiative that allowed students from both countries to deeply experience each other's culture, educational environments, and community life, reflecting the school's dedication to nurturing globally responsible citizens.

A delegation from Germany comprising seventeen students arrived with their Principal, Ms. Petra Schiele, along with Ms. Alexandra Nikolic, teacher and Mr. Michael Andreas Jaschek, parent representative. An equal number of students from Christ School CISCE were selected as partners. The collaboration created opportunities for students to learn together, explore together, and engage in meaningful cultural and academic exchanges.

The programme offered several enriching benefits to the participants. Students developed intercultural competence by observing and engaging with diverse cultural norms and communication styles. Their understanding of global citizenship was strengthened through shared experiences that fostered tolerance, empathy, and respect. Academically, they explored a wide range of subjects through structured sessions in art, music, science, social studies, and environmental studies. Language skills were naturally enhanced as German students participated in English-based sessions, while Indian students had earlier familiarised themselves with basic German expressions. 




