

A SEMINAR ON LEGAL AWARENESS

On 28th August 2025, a seminar on Legal Awareness was organized under the initiative Meet the Great – "Real People, Real Purpose" by the Quality Enhancement Committee. The session was graced by Prof. Dr. Sairam Bhat, Professor of Law at the National Law School of India University and Co-Director of the Centre for Environmental Law, Education, Research and Advocacy (CEERA).

The seminar aimed to enlighten students about the importance of understanding and following the law in everyday life. Dr. Bhat emphasized that obedience to law is a fundamental duty and that ignorance of the law is not an acceptable excuse for committing crimes. He warned that when a youth commits an offence, it could lead to serious consequences such as loss of future job opportunities or denial of admission to educational institutions.

He also highlighted that youth are not only responsible for themselves but also accountable to their families, with even parents potentially held liable under certain legal provisions. The thought-provoking discussion drew attention to the distinction between legality and ethics, reminding students that not everything legal is necessarily

ethical. Dr. Bhat responded to students' questions with professionalism and insight, fostering a highly interactive and engaging environment. Rather than relying on a conventional lecture format, he enriched the session with well-crafted narratives and relevant real-life examples, making complex legal ideas accessible and relatable to the audience.

The event concluded with a vote of thanks by Fr. Nilson Davis CMI, our Principal, who shared his reflections and concluded with a powerful message: "Where there is law, there is freedom."


